The Department of Social Work under School of Professional Studies, NSOU celebrated the Human Rights Day on 10th December 2025 from 3:30 PM to 5:00 PM through online mode (Zoom). The program was titled as "Relevance of Human Rights in the Field of Social Work". All the faculty members of the department along with the Director of the School of Professional Studies were present for the celebration. There were about 132 participants attended the program and most of the participants were the learners of social work discipline (MSW) however there were even learners who were from other courses came to be a part of this auspicious occasion. Some of the academic counsellors of social work program also attended the program through online.

Dr Kasturi Sinha Ghosh, Assistant Professor of Social Work NSOU, at the outset extended a warm welcome to all the participants and then in invited Professor Anirban Ghosh, Director (i/c), SPS to deliver the presidential address. Professor Ghosh welcomed all the participants who were present for the program and introduced the audience about the teaching learning process of Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU). Prof. Ghosh said that in a way, our university is also contributing to ensure rights to higher education for everyone without any discrimination. He urged the participants to be sensitive enough to the various issues which promote inequality in our society. He further said that we must always see to it that none of our society members are deprived of their basic human rights and we must be responsible enough to ensure that people are enjoying their human rights in the society.

Followed by the presidential address, Dr Monojit Garai, Assistant Professor in Social Work, NSOU, greeted the participants on behalf of the department and the university. He shared that celebrating human rights day only for one day we will not serve the purpose, we must understand the core essence of human rights and as professional social worker must always ensure that human rights for everyone is ensured throughout the year. Kalyan Kumar Sanyal, Associate Professor of the department and then invited Dr Kasturi Sinha Ghosh, Assistant Professor in Social Work to introduce the main theme of the program.





Prof K.K Sanyal also raised some points of concern, while discussing in what ways Human Rights are often violated and said that here is were the Social Workers have to play a vital role as catalyst and through their professional skill must come forward and tackle the cases of infringements of rights in a much pragmatic way.
